## Values-Based Decision Making Model

1.	What is the issue/goal/challenge facing the Chapter?
2.	Who are the stakeholders and how are they affected?
3.	What are the potential options/solutions/actions?
4.	Are the options consistent with our stated Core Values (Friendship, Justice, & Learning) (If options under consideration conflict with/dishonor our core values, the option is eliminated.)
5.	If still unsure about a decision, ask these questions: a) Is it just? Will you be violating criminal, campus, or fraternal laws by engaging in this activity?
	b) Will it build goodwill and friendships? It is fair to stakeholders in the short-term as well as over the long term?
	c) Is it right? How does the decision make you feel about yourself? Would you like others to know you made this decision?
6.	Choose the best option and build a strategic plan around it.
Note: After implementing decisions you should take time to ask the following:	
1.	Was this the best decision I could have made at the time given the facts and circumstances?
2.	If I faced this situation again, would I do anything differently?
3.	What lessons did I learn that I could apply in the future?
