



## SUPPORTERS OF SIGMA CHI,

In 2019, the Sigma Chi Foundation reached new heights: a Greek-letter foundation record in grant and leadership support for our young brothers and an organizational record in academic scholarships awarded.

In late February, however, the world as we know it changed.

Each facet of Sigma Chi was impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic. Undergraduate chapters closed as campuses shuttered, and, due to the dangers of the coronavirus and travel, the Fraternity and Sigma Chi Leadership Institute (SCLI) were forced to make tough choices, including the cancellation of the 2020 Horizons Huntsman Leadership Summit and conversion of our largest-funded leadership event, the Krach Transformational Leaders Workshop, to an exclusively virtual format.

Our Foundation development team was largely sidelined for three months, and members of our Headquarters staff in Evanston, Illinois, were moved into remote roles. Yet, through everything, Sigma Chi and your Sigma Chi Foundation persevered and moved forward.

As you'll see in this report, despite the interruption to a typically strong spring quarter, we met each of our commitments to the organization for the 2019 to 2020 fiscal year. And, while not as grand as our record 2019 fundraising effort, our team closed the fiscal year effectively, maintaining an equally strong outlook for the present fiscal year.

This fall, we awarded \$3.92 million in scholarships and grants to Sigma Chi and the Sigma Chi Leadership Institute. Our brothers have received close to \$350,000 in academic awards and are guaranteed the support of Regional Chapter Support Coordinators as well as world-class educational programming courtesy of the Sigma Chi Leadership Institute.

In its own report, you read of the Sigma Chi Leadership Institute achieving authorization from the Illinois Board of Higher Education for its first certified leadership program. This program will be made available to our members in a

pilot phase starting in 2021. This is another positive step among many for Sigma Chi as it remains the standard-bearer among Greek-letter organizations – all made possible by the direct support of our donors over the last decade.

As our lives return to normal and our brothers continue their pursuit of excellence on campuses across North America, your contributions to Sigma Chi have never been more important.

My fellow board members and our Foundation team are committed to raising the funds necessary to further expand the reach of the leadership development and training efforts provided by SCLI, as well as enhance our support of academic scholarships. Our work in providing these much-needed resources for our members is perhaps more important today than it was in February before our world changed because of COVID-19.

With your support, we will send a message to our undergraduate brothers that we are committed to their future and the success of Sigma Chi.

## PRESIDENT & CEO REPORT

Looking back at our 2019 to 2020 fiscal year — a year unlike any other in the history of our organization — the generosity shown by our alumni and friends, particularly during the a global pandemic, cannot be overstated

In a difficult time, when it is not easy to advance our brotherhood, serve our young men and fully address all of the challenges surrounding us personally and professionally, I am inspired by your dedication and commitment, by the chapter leaders who are determined to be part of the solution, by the thinkers who are reimagining what it means to be a Fraternity, and by the generosity of the thousands of brothers who contribute to put the wind in our collective sails. Thank you for expecting more.

As our new chairman, Significant Sig John Forst, **GEORGE WASHINGTON 1984**, noted, we were able to meet growing funding commitments in scholarships and leadership programming and expand the reach of our training efforts across Sigma Chi.

When the impact of COVID-19 across our Sigma Chi undergraduate chapters became widely known, we were immediately called to action by the stories of those brothers who were directly affected by the pandemic. Some of these young men were displaced from their campus residences, lost employment, were forced to leave abroad programs or returned home to find families facing unforeseen hardships. Thanks to you our Brothers Helping Brothers fund provided critical and timely assistance when it was most needed.

On behalf of those brothers whose stories you'll see later in this report, thank you for supporting this cause.

We recently completed the fourth year of our joint Foundation and Fraternity strategic plan, and the results are clear:

- We continue to deliver more significant value to our chapters and undergraduates than any other Greek-letter foundation.
- The Sigma Chi Leadership Institute (SCLI), funded by decades of continuous donor support, received Illinois state licensure and will begin providing

our brothers with certified values-based leadership curriculum — a game-changing first in the Greek-letter world.

- We remain on track, in spite of the pandemic, to further growth of program grants, academic scholarships and undergraduate chapter support over the next decade.
- We are also well on our way to being on par with the fiscal performance and efficiency of great universities, and we are setting the pace in our Greek-letter world.

### LEADER IN THE GREEK-LETTER WORLD

Over the past 10 years, your Foundation has provided \$29.9 million in support of Sigma Chi programs and academic scholarships — and this does not include the over \$18 million of support simultaneously provided for chapter-specific projects.

While the present fiscal year will see a slight reduction in grant support, largely related to the reduction of expenses for programs such as the Horizons Huntsman Leadership Summit that were unable to operate due to COVID-19 restrictions, we continue to outpace our Greek-letter colleagues.

Our fiscal year scorecard on page 78 will further show that our performance metrics, such as the cost of raising a dollar and percentage of our gifts going directly to our mission, remain the industry standard.

Our Foundation beats the average of our Greek-letter peers in every category, we are materially better than the thresholds established by charity watchdog groups like Charity Navigator and the Better Business Bureau, and we are close to matching the performance of great universities in terms of efficiency.

Furthermore, the great work of our Board of Governors and Foundation staff, along with your support, have maintained the Sigma Chi Foundation's place as the top Greek-letter fraternity foundation.

According to the 2020 Pennington and Company Fraternity and Sorority Report (FY 18-19 IRS Form 990) your Sigma Chi Foundation:

- Was best in the Greek-letter world in every identifiable category, including net assets, contributions, revenue, program services (grants and academic scholarships) and expenses out of 89 groups.
- Contributed more toward leadership programming, general grants and academic scholarship support than any Greek-letter organization.
- Raised 10 percent of what the entire industry raised — 8.5 times the Greek-letter average — and granted 9 percent of what the entire industry granted to our Sigma Chi members.

## THE YEAR AHEAD

As our nation and the world recover from this pandemic, we have made changes to our operations to get us through the pandemic and position Sigma Chi for continued success.

Operating expenses have been reduced by 28 percent in this difficult year. Over the past five years our non-grant expense — the cost of everything we do other than giving money away — has actually decreased by 16 percent while we've given away 64 percent more on an annual basis.

With the continued success of our online programming through SCLI (more than 24,000 registered Sigma Chi users) and the launch of Sigma Chi's first certified academic-licensed programs, we expect to see positive behavior metrics such as fewer instances of substance abuse, hazing, behavioral and sexual misconduct. Meanwhile, we also expect to see brothers becoming more involved on campus and increasing their contributions to philanthropic efforts.

We are all looking forward and working to make tomorrow's Sigma Chi even better. And I hope that you will continue to join us on our quest to build better men who are prepared to succeed in college and throughout their lives.

We're asking for your continued engagement, volunteerism and financial support to make it all a reality.

I wish you and your family great health and happiness as we say goodbye to 2020 with a bright 2021 in front of us.

Thank you for your continued support. We are truly grateful.

# FOUNDATION FISCAL SUMMARY

**T**he Sigma Chi Foundation has built upon the investments it made during the previous fiscal year, including in the areas of expanding leadership programs, chapter support and scholarship efforts. Likewise, the Foundation has continued its support of Sigma Chi's educational and membership development programs and the "One Voice" strategic plan.

The Foundation manages its internal operations and tracks progress on an accrual basis. An annual audited financial statement is developed under the review of the Foundation's audit and compliance committee and used in preparation of the Internal Revenue Service Form 990. Legacy Professionals, LLP, conducted the Foundation's certified audit.

This year's Annual Report presents the Foundation's fiscal performance on an audited accrual basis, thus aligning our transparency with recommendations of the Better Business Bureau's (BBB) Wise Giving Alliance Standards for Charity Accountability.

## LEADERSHIP PROGRAMS AND GRANTS

**T**he Sigma Chi Foundation's overarching goal is to positively impact every undergraduate brother every year with values-based leadership training and support.

During the fall and initial third of the spring semester, our members were provided with world-class leadership curriculum, helping them develop into character-based leaders who are committed to the betterment of their chapters, campus and community. This included the launch of the Sigma Chi Leadership Institute's new Values-Based Decision Making program.

In March, however, the COVID-19 pandemic effectively closed Sigma Chi chapters, pressed pause on pivotal in-person leadership events, such as Horizons Huntsman Leadership Summit, and shifted the Krach Transformational Leaders Workshop to a virtual event.

With in-person education halted, and the future of on-campus education largely unknown by summer, the SCLI team molded online modules for the pandemic using the Strong Arms mental health and wellness program and Mission 365 recruitment training program to help members navigate challenges during this time.

The Foundation also assisted young brothers who were displaced and faced hardships during the pandemic by converting the Brothers Helping Brothers grant

program to an essential aid mechanism and providing financial assistance to more than 120 individuals.

### **BROTHERS HELPING BROTHERS**

As the COVID-19 pandemic slowly made its way across the globe, disrupting and altering lives, undergraduate Sigma Chis living at home and abroad were faced with unexpected challenges.

Upon news of campus closures and members being displaced and losing unemployment, the Foundation revised its Brothers Helping Brothers fund to meet the needs of brothers impacted by the pandemic.

Following Hurricane Katrina, the fund — formerly known as the Strong Arms Initiative — provided scholarship and grant support during a time of emergency. As the pandemic grew and brothers needed assistance, availability of the fund was expanded toward assisting those who suffered a break of employment, were displaced from their campus residences with short-term housing or faced other burdens associated with dislocation.

By the end of the fiscal year, the fund had rewarded more than \$80,000 in assistance to over 120 brothers.



“Sigma Chi has not only given me the opportunity to develop as a man, student and friend; Sigma Chi — with the aid of brothers around the world — has also assisted me in a time of great despair: the

COVID-19 pandemic. **LEADERSHIP PROGRAM SUPPORT**

**PREPARATION FOR BROTHERHOOD / RITUAL FOR LIFE**

Thanks to the support of a lead gift from Significant Sig David Pyle, **SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA 1980**, the Preparation for Brotherhood (P4B) new member education module became a critical first step in a Sigma Chi’s lifelong learning journey upon its launch during the 2015 to 2016 academic year.

Since its implementation, resulting program data points to higher pledge retention rates each year, an overall increase in pledge-class GPA each year and an increase in leadership development and involvement among our members. Additionally, chapters that implement P4B perfectly are 80 percent less likely to experience an allegation of hazing.

Upon initiation, members were presented with a comprehensive Ritual education curriculum in 2019.

Ritual for Life (R4L) was designed to educate each chapter’s new initiates on Sigma Chi’s Ritual history and inspire them to apply the Ritual’s lessons to their lives for the betterment of their chapter, campus and community.

**VALUES-BASED DECISION MAKING**

In fall 2019, a hybrid learning curriculum touching on the challenging issues within the Greek-letter community, Values-Based Decision Making (VBDM), the Fraternity’s accountability education, was made available to Sigma Chi chapters.

Through the lead support of Order of Constantine Sig and Significant Sig Bob Georges, **FLORIDA SOUTHERN 1973**, VBDM is based on a more personalized learning experience that can be tailored to the needs of chapters and individuals, as well as be delivered in variety of educational settings and venues, including chapters, Sigma Chi Online, province conferences and the Krach Transformational Leaders Workshop.

VBDM addresses accountability and the challenging issues on our college campuses today from a positive behavioral approach, meaning that we explore these topics with the goal of inspiring change through positive reinforcement of brotherhood, healthy relationships and our values.

The program will be part of the educational plan for Sigma Chi colonies moving forward.

**MISSION 365 REMOTE RECRUITMENT**

As undergraduate chapters faced a great unknown relating to fall recruitment and return to campus activities during the pandemic, the Sigma Chi Leadership Institute team utilized materials from the successful Mission 365 recruitment



training program and developed a virtual Mission 365 Remote Recruitment platform to give chapters the necessary skills to recruit quality men into our Fraternity via digital methods.

Delivered in person with online elements during a non-pandemic year, the main Mission 365 program provides a core curriculum and six electives that support our undergraduate brothers in looking for men of good character 365 days a year. As noted within the SCLI report, the remote module helped chapters maintain strong results during a pandemic year.

## STRONG ARMS FOR COVID-19

Unveiled in 2018, Sigma Chi's Strong Arms curriculum became the Greek-letter world's first dedicated learning resource to address mental wellness and emotional health. Its groundbreaking approach earned it the 2019 Laurel Wreath Award for outstanding education within the North American Interfraternity Conference.

During the course of the COVID-19 pandemic, mental health issues became a recurring theme across North America and the globe. With this in mind, the SCLI team developed a Strong Arms module specifically catered to those impacted by the pandemic.

Along with the Reach Out app, which connects members to in-house and community resources, such as helplines, counseling services, emergency responders, rape crisis centers, legal aid services and medical care providers, Sigma Chi continued to proceed with the health and well-being of actives, alumni, employees and friends in mind this year.

## KRACH TRANSFORMATIONAL LEADERS WORKSHOP

As noted within the SCLI section, the Krach Transformational Leaders Workshop shifted from an in-person event to a virtual offering in 2020 due to the pandemic.

Thanks to the hard work of the SCLI team and volunteers, selected members from each of Sigma Chi's undergraduate chapters were able to undergo mentoring and strategic planning sessions to ensure improvement in their chapter roles and operations throughout the forthcoming academic year.

The workshop is sponsored by a lead endowment gift from 64th Grand Consul Keith Krach, **PURDUE 1979**, who is the former chairman and CEO of DocuSign and Ariba and the current U.S. Under Secretary for Economic Growth, Energy and the Environment.

## HORIZONS HUNTSMAN LEADERSHIP SUMMIT

For the first time since its inception in 1999, the Horizons Huntsman Leadership Summit was canceled due to the COVID-19 pandemic. The in-person, six-day

leadership program located in Snowbird, Utah, was slated to provide leadership development for nearly 250 undergraduates over five weeks during the summer.

Brothers selected to participate during the 2020 campaign will have the first opportunity to participate in summer 2021. The Huntsman Cancer Foundation and the Sigma Chi Foundation generously fund 100 percent of the Huntsman Leadership Summit experience through a leadership grant. This includes all travel, housing, food, curriculum, materials and activity costs.

## FRATERNITY GRANTS

The Foundation provided \$630,000 to support the continued growth of the Fraternity's chapter support program. The chapter support team provides operational guidance and assistance to the Fraternity's undergraduate chapters. The team consists of 10 regional chapter support coordinators who all live within their regions and work with approximately 25 chapters each.

During summer 2020, with campus schedules largely unknown due to the pandemic, these men trained each of the chapters they mentor using the Sigma Chi Leadership Institute's Mission 365 Remote Recruitment training module, as well as a recruitment guide provided by the Fraternity.

"The chapters were hungry for ways to recruit in this new environment, and this helped give them some tools to get the job done," said Chris Hicks, **GEORGIA SOUTHWESTERN 1996**, who is the chapter support coordinator for the southeast region.

- This past summer, 78 chapters were recognized with Peterson Significant Chapter Awards sponsored by the Foundation. Established in 1964, the Peterson Award recognizes chapters that achieve excellence in all operations, including academics, philanthropy, recruitment and Ritual performance.
- The Massachusetts-Amherst chapter received a \$5,000 educational grant for having the Fraternity's most outstanding scholastic achievement program, thus earning it the prestigious Daniel William Cooper Award.
- The Foundation and Fraternity honored 94 brothers with the Significant Sig Award. These brothers will receive their award during regional and local ceremonies or have the option to receive their award at the 83rd Grand Chapter in Scottsdale, Arizona, after the COVID-19 pandemic forced Grand Council to a virtual setting. Awarded annually since 1935, more than 1,700 alumni have received the award, which recognizes members who have achieved high levels of professional success.

## ACADEMIC SCHOLARSHIPS

Each year, the generous donations from our alumni and friends make it possible for the Sigma Chi Foundation to grant academic scholarships and awards to our deserving undergraduate and graduate brothers and sweethearts. Providing scholarships and academic awards furthers the Foundation's goal to promote academic excellence and volunteerism. We proudly award brothers who show outstanding leadership, academic motivation and commitment to their chapters and communities.

The Foundation will provide close to \$350,000 in academic scholarships to undergraduate and graduate students throughout the 2020 to 2021 academic

year thanks to contributions made during the 2018 to 2019 fiscal year.

This year, thanks to the Donor-Scholar Awards initiative as well as the Thomas Cowan Bell Chapter Challenge program, 235 individuals are recognized specifically by the Foundation. Awards include undergraduate general academic scholarships; military service; and graduate scholarships in international business, engineering, medicine, general academic studies, media and law. The monetary total also includes the International Balfour Award, International Sweetheart, chapter sweetheart, Daniel William Cooper and Legion of Honor recipients.

### *International Balfour Award*

Sigma Chi's highest undergraduate honor, the International Balfour Award, is presented to the brother who best exemplifies Sigma Chi through his academic performance and demonstrated leadership. He is awarded \$10,000 from the Foundation, thanks to the support of Brandon Chaney, **INDIANA 1993**, who is proprietor and CEO of Fairwinds Estate Winery in California.

Samuel Romes, **LOUISVILLE 2020**, is this year's recipient. Romes, pictured at right, graduated from the University of Louisville in Louisville, Kentucky, with a degree in chemical engineering. He was involved in several organizations on campus, including raiseRED, the university's largest student-run philanthropic

organization, where he served as both team leader and programming director and helped raise more than \$690,000 for pediatric oncology and hematology.

While as a member of the Fraternity's Louisville chapter, Romes held the position of Consul and helped his chapter attain Top Organization and Top Fraternity awards from raiseRED with \$77,000 raised.

But, he also has maintained an active presence within the Zeta Psi chapter by serving on several committees while volunteering in the community as a tutor at an inner-city high school and taking four trips to Nicaragua, where he helped build schools, bathrooms and create pipelines for clean drinking water.

# PAYING IT FORWARD

## *Honor societies and alumni engagement*

**T**hanks to the generous support of our alumni brothers and friends of Sigma Chi, the Sigma Chi Foundation is able to provide nearly \$10,000 in leadership program and academic scholarship support to every undergraduate chapter every year, which is far beyond what any other Greek-letter fraternity has been able to accomplish.

Hand in hand with the Sigma Chi International Fraternity, the Foundation is working to do everything possible to help our young brothers deal with university life in the most positive way. Our annual giving and alumni engagement opportunities are crafted to align Sigma Chi's needs with the broad goals of our donors.

Giving societies were established to honor members who donate at certain levels or in a certain way. Gift clubs honor lifetime giving as well as various levels of annual donations toward the Life Loyal Sig Annual Fund program, Thomas Cowan Bell Chapter Challenge, planned giving, various program funds, Donor-Scholar Awards or Foundation-operated scholarship funds, naming opportunities or historical initiatives.

## *Making a Difference*

### **LIFE LOYAL SIG ANNUAL GIVING**

Whether it's world-class leadership curriculum through the Sigma Chi Leadership Institute, academic scholarships or operational funding, one-time or recurring monthly or annual gifts to the revamped Life Loyal Sig annual giving program are invested into every aspect of our mission.

On average, the Foundation generates more revenue, provides more program support and directs more money to leadership initiatives and scholarships than any other Greek-letter fraternity or sorority foundation, according to the 2020 Pennington & Company Greek[-letter] Foundation report, but there is much more to be done. Increases in funding along, with the addition of Sigma Chi's more recent leadership training modules through Sigma Chi Online, serve as evidence of the work sponsored through these unrestricted annual donations.

The Life Loyal Sig program provides members with an opportunity to provide additional monthly and annual support to the continued growth and success of our Fraternity. These contributions annually support our general academic scholarships and increased developmental efforts, as well as the opportunity

for every Sigma Chi chapter to request one of the many workshops concerning everything from drug and alcohol abuse to recruitment. It also allows us to better communicate with alumni and operate the Sigma Chi International Fraternity Headquarters and historical facilities.

### **DONOR-SCHOLAR AWARDS**

The Foundation's Donor-Scholar Awards provide a naming opportunity to interested alumni who wish to directly support the Foundation's expanding scholarship program. Donors contributing to this effort at an endowment level (a one-time gift of \$25,000) will have an annual academic scholarship named for them or an honoree for a minimum of 30 years. Donors also are encouraged to establish a mentor relationship with the recipients.

### **SIGMA CHI LEADERSHIP INSTITUTE SPONSORSHIP**

By providing our members with world-class leadership curriculum, Sigma Chi is developing young men into character-based leaders who are committed to the betterment of their chapters, campus and community. By supporting a major initiative, such as Sigma Chi Online, the Krach Transformational Leaders Workshop, Horizons Huntsman Leadership Summit or one of the certified educational modules SCLI is providing our members beginning in January 2021, alumni are funding the tools necessary to expand and continually improve educational opportunities for Sigma Chi's undergraduate brothers.

### **HISTORICAL INITIATIVE**

Founded in 2005 by 20th Grand Historian Eric Hansen, **CINCINNATI 1989**, and members of the Fraternity's Historical Commission with a grant from the Foundation, the Historical Initiative oversees the care and preservation of the Fraternity's historical collection, including the Chuck and Kim Watson Museum of Sigma Chi, the Sigma Chi Founding Site in Oxford, Ohio, and the monuments and memorials of our Fraternity. It is estimated that the various collections hold nearly 250,000 documents, images and three-dimensional artifacts. A significant way to support Sigma Chi's historical initiative, leadership and scholarship efforts is to provide a naming and sponsorship level gift. Opportunities include exhibits and artifacts within the museum, archival preservation efforts and displays at the Founding Site.



### **DISTINGUISHED VISITORS PROGRAM**

The Foundation's Distinguished Visitors program has since its inception in the 1980s provided alumni with an opportunity to reconnect with their Sigma Chi roots and impact undergraduate brothers. Prior to the pandemic, alumni participated with visits to the Horizons Huntsman Leadership Summit in Snowbird, Utah, and the Krach Transformational Leaders Workshop in Bowling Green, Ohio. These men, who are among Sigma Chi's most accomplished brothers, are encouraged to share their wisdom and perspective on leadership, character and values with undergraduate brothers during their visits which are tentatively slated to continue in 2021.

### **REGIONAL ALUMNI RECEPTIONS**

Prior to the COVID-19 pandemic, the Sigma Chi Foundation Board of Governors and staff made a targeted effort to connect with alumni in U.S. metropolitan areas with special reception events. Hosted by Foundation board members and donors, these events provided an opportunity to deliver updates from the General Fraternity and to share Sigma Chi's forward direction. Due to the pandemic, the Foundation will begin implementing virtual events via Zoom until the pandemic subsides. ### **PLANNED GIVING**

### **GIFTS BY BEQUEST**
