THE PARTNERSHIP

In 2021, the Sigma Chi Foundation, noting the rising need for educational support among the families of Gold Star and wounded military service members, joined with Folds of Honor to provide educational support to students who meet Folds of Honor criteria on campuses with an active Sigma Chi undergraduate chapter.

UNIQUE OPPORTUNITY

The Sigma Chi Foundation (SCF), on average, has provided more than \$4 million annually in grants, program funding and academic scholarships to Sigma Chi entities and its undergraduate members since 2014.

For the first time in SCF history, this partnership will impact individuals unaffiliated with our Fraternity on campuses where Sigma Chi operates.

Much like undergraduate chapters' fundraising efforts for charitable causes of their choice, the Sigma Chi Foundation's partnership with Folds of Honor allows Sigma Chi alumni to further honor the 918 brothers that paid the ultimate sacrifice since Sigma Chi's founding, including five brothers killed in action during the recent conflicts in Iraq and Afghanistan, and provide an additional charitable outlet on behalf of our current chapters with educational support for individuals whose own family member sacrificed themselves for our nation.
