

PROCESS OF THE CHAPTER & MEMBER ACCOUNTABILITY COMMITTEE (CAMAC)

WHAT IS CAMAC?

CAMAC is responsible for holding *undergraduate chapters* and the *individual members* of those chapters *accountable* for actions that violate Fraternity & University Policy. CAMAC *collaborates with universities* and advocates for decisions that will *improve the culture* of undergraduate chapters.

CAMAC is comprised of a former Grand Consul, three Grand Praetors, one Grand Trustee, two alumni and two undergraduates.

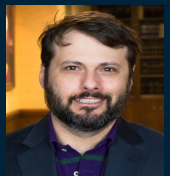

Chapter Receives a Seven Day Letter

1

This letter requires a chapter to draft a written response to the allegations, which must be received by the Director of Accountability within seven days from the issuance of the letter.



With more severe allegations, chapters may also receive an *interim suspension*, which requires chapters to cease all operations and events, except for ritualistic meetings.

Chapter Submits Seven Day Letter Response

2

Chapters are asked to include all dates, names, and information requested of them in the seven day letter response. Chapters may not leave out any information, even if it seems irrelevant or unnecessary.



CAMAC asks chapters to provide *as much detail and information as possible* to assist Sigma Chi in best advocating for our chapters in conversations with the university.

CAMAC Investigates Conduct Allegations

3

The investigation process may include conversations with chapter members, alumni, witnesses, and university officials. It typically takes between 1-3 months for chapters to hear back about a decision.



Throughout this step, chapters must *comply and work with* any corresponding university investigations, conduct hearings and judicial processes.

Chapter Receives Conduct Outcome

4

If the university is also involved, CAMAC will strive to have a similar conduct decision, provided the university is conducting a fair and equitable process with their investigation.



Ultimately, CAMAC will proactively work to determine the best outcome that *ensures the safety and wellness* of our undergraduate chapters and members.
